ACADEMIC POSITION – Clinician Teacher

The Department of Medicine, Division of Geriatric Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, at Western University and London Health Sciences Centre (LHSC) and St. Joseph's Health Care (SJHC) are seeking 2 Geriatricians for fulltime Clinical Teacher or Clinical Researcher academic appointment to Western University.

The Division of Geriatric Medicine currently has 12 members and is well-recognized and respected both nationally and internationally. The Division's physicians provide care and supervise the Acute Care of the Elderly (ACE) Unit, a medicine CTU at LHSC Victoria Campus, a 30 bed Geriatric Rehabilitation Unit at the Parkwood Institute of SJHC, and a veteran's dementia care unit at Parkwood Institute. Other services are ambulatory clinics for general geriatrics, memory clinics, a day hospital, and a regional outreach program. The Division has a fully certified Royal College Subspecialty Training Program in the Department of Medicine currently with 4 R4 or R5 trainees.

The successful candidate is expected to have completed training in Internal Medicine and Geriatric Medicine. Applicants should be certified, or eligible for certification, in Geriatric Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD, or equivalent, and must be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO) in the province of Ontario. The successful candidate will hold a limited term academic appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor or Associate Professor, or a continuing academic appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor depending on qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will join a busy academic practice and be expected to develop research or quality improvement projects that engage medical students and residents and that are relevant to our hospitals and region's needs. Additionally, the candidate is expected to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels, supervise graduate trainees and serve as mentors for students, residents, and faculty. Expected clinical roles include serving on the ACE CTU, GRU, out-patient clinics, Consultation-Liaison team in acute care, day hospital, and outreach. Opportunities include innovative team research platforms in cognition, dementia, delirium, falls, quality improvement, and educational program development.
