Photographs

Photographs submitted electronically must be in jpeg format. Hard copy prints of photos submitted during the tournament must be printed on 4x6 size high quality photo paper. The artistic quality of each photograph is very important so be especially careful to take the time to take a good photograph. Protect the photographs by placing them in plastic sheet protector that has a hole punch on the left hand margin.

Reflective Narratives Assignment

A reflective narrative is a written record. Please note the narratives have to conform with the following criteria: caption describing the photograph has to be in the title in spacing font Arial margins for sides 1/2 inches ONE page only. As instructed not to read more than one page. Anything you write beyond this is not graded. Try to see three paragraphs to reflect on the topic of your narrative. The following general questions help to guide in assignments and what do you see here. What is really happening. Why did this situation happen. How does this relate to your values. What can you do about it. What changes if you could propose. For assignments and guiding questions please refer under the assignment description.

Naming

The filename for the reflective piece should be the same as the filename of the photograph that should include your initials and first initial only and the first words of the caption you have chosen for the photo. Example: ZAGG and side. Less than 10 words in the name is so accepted. You lose points if you do not properly name your files. Remember the title of the narrative or the caption of the photograph must not contain personal identifiers such as names of the person for the occasion.

Bring the assignment

Bring to MONDAY before deadline you submit the electronic version of the narrative and photograph onto the course. Here you will find the icons. Assignment Photo to post the photo and Assignment Narrative to submit the reflective piece to submit. Please be advised that you are not allowed to submit your narrative for your assignment. For assignments and you will see on your submission to submit your narrative.

For PhotoVoice assignments you will submit to the A:

A printout of the photo size 4x6 printed on photo quality paper

Note: A three things should be placed in plastic protective sheet with hole punch on the left hand margin.

Please note that hard copies of your assignments should be submitted to your A in plastic sheet protector.
