Explication du barème:

1. Tests de grammaire

Two assessments will be conducted for about 60 minutes each. If you are not able to write the test for a valid reason, you must provide adequate written justification in order to be granted a make-up test (see section “*Accommodations for work missed due to problems*” in *Important Academic and Administrative Information*).

2. Compositions

Students will write two compositions during the session. Those assignments are designed to assess the students’ ability to put into practice the writing techniques acquired during the session. The topic for each composition will be posted on Sakai a week before the assignment due date.

3. Tests de compréhension orale

The two listening tests are designed to assess the students’ ability to understand and explain the main ideas of a conversation or a recorded text.

4. Examen final

The final exam assesses students’ knowledge of the material covered in class: grammar, vocabulary, content of texts, and writing techniques. **The final exam is 2 hours long. No aids are allowed.**

5. Présence et Participation

The success of your learning experience in this course requires that you regularly attend classes. This is particularly true of language courses. A total of 10% of your course grade in French 2906B is based on attendance (assiduity) and participation. Two unjustified absences will make you lose 1 mark out of the 10%. If you must miss classes for a valid reason, you should speak with your professor and provide adequate (written) justification for your absence. **It is your responsibility to ensure that you sign the attendance sheet at each class.**
