- 1) Reconciliation through investment in Indigenous people: The reviews note that one of the main elements that make Indigenous studies units distinctive is a fullyfunctioning department. It is perhaps most distinguishable bythe large proportion of Indigenous students ithin its ranks of majors. In turn, often the majority of registrants in IS courses are Indigenous students, which not onlyprovides mutual support for them but raises the level of debate in the classrooms in productivelycomplex ways. Creating and sustaining an investment in attracting and supporting Indigenous students and staff requires IS departments to be staffed in sufficient human resources.
- 2) Valuing Indigenous Studies Knowledges, Worldviews and Ontologies: The reviews note that Universities are organized around epistemological perspectives and pillars, and departments house and lead significant disciplinaryknowledge. In an Indigenous studies contex t in particular, anydiscussions of Indigenous studies as a discipline must acknowledge and theorize their central importance, because lacking an institutional presence inhibits their ability to carryout their disciplinaryvision and mission. Simplyput, like all disciplines, programs such as Women's Studies and Indigenous Studies are emerging disciplines in their ow right and as such are withyof Departmental status. The commitment to invest in such programs by elevating them to departmental status sends an important message about the high value priority placed upon the knowledge that such disciplines hold and lead. Toward that end, departmental status offers vital positioning for Indigenous studies to create intellectual elbowroom for themselves on campus;

- 2. The newDepartment of Indigenous Studies should engage an outside facilitator two has ex pertise in both strategic academic planning and Indigenous academic programming to codevelop a comprehensive academic plan alongside other Indigenous partners.
- 3. It is recommended that Western develop a strategic plan that invests substantiallyin one Indigenous language program (that the FNS program ill possess a major role in the positioning of) through attention to succession and mentoring so that Western ill be seen as the go to lead institution for re-vitalization of this language.
- 4. It is recommended that, in addition to its attention to more typical forms of university assessment, that the FNS program seek, then possible, to include an arrayof partners including, importantly, Indigenous partners in discussions about the diversity of knokedge forms that they might deem beneficial.
- 5. It is recommended that the FNS program engage in intensive professional development facilitated by Indigenous studies scholars and other Indigenous knokedge holders ho can assist them in identifying keyapproaches to teac hing that benefit Indigenous organizations & communities and assist them in considering howhese might be positioned as transformative ex periences across the program.
- 6. It is recommended that the FNS program consider re-orienting the time focus of its chair towns at least one third of time commitment to engaging ith Indigenous communitypartners and inter-universitypolytechnic relations, or hire a part-time administrative liaison person accompanied by some minimum time commitment to this bythe chair.
- 7. It is recommended that, in addition to its commitment to building a plan for investment in Indigenous language succession, that the FNS program, after developing its strategic academic
