## 4. Course Description and Design

Organized as a creative research intensive, Making Art with Environmental Awareness explores artistic responses to ecology, sustainability, and related social issues in various global/local contexts. The course examines select themes in environmental discourse—paying particular attention to how artists have engaged with them. Some examples of lesson themes are: Extinctions; Petro-cultures; Accelerationism and Food. Each week, a new theme is introduced, and, students will view online material, engage in critical writing and/or other online activities in response to these themes.
