Assignments will be posted on our OWL course site. Modifications to the schedule may occur from time to time, but students will be notified through Announcements on OWL. *Check that Owl Announcements are sent to your phone. I post updates and additional information regularly that sometimes require a response.*

Exception: in Writing Studies courses, a student seeking academic accommodation **on non-medical grounds** for any missed in-class tests/exams, class attendance/participation components, or late or missed assignments **worth less than 10% of a final grade** may first consult directly with her or his instructor, who will in his or her discretion elect either to make a decision on the request directly or instruct the student to follow the procedures set out in **Writing Studie**.

Please note that individual instructors will **not under any circumstances** accept or read medical documentation directly offered by a student, whether in support of an application for accommodation on medical grounds or for related reasons (e.g. to explain an absence from class which may result in a grade penalty under an **absence** rse). **All medical documentation must** be submitted to the Academic Counselling or Undergraduate office of a student **in person**.
